April 2024 Health Suite Chronicles Notes

I have recently received the **updated COVID-19 policy from Health Services**. I am forwarding the information to everyone. Please read when you have a moment so you know and understand the newest protocols being followed in BCPS's.

Please note, the updated COVID-19 policy mentions the ability of a parent to request a COVID-19 test kit from the health suite to be sent home with a student. I have ordered a small supply of these COVID-19 test kits but they have not as yet arrived. I will always have a very small supply, so please use test kits you may already have whenever possible.

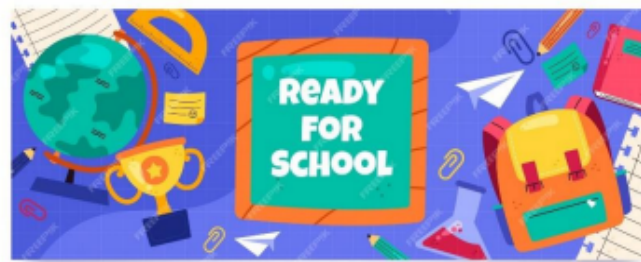
Allergy season is upon us! PLEASE remember to give your child who suffers with allergies their non-drowsy allergy medicine at home, before school begins, so they will be more comfortable throughout the day. The only medication I have in the health suite to help with allergies is Benadryl, but it tends to make the child very sleepy, even in a reduced dose.

Playground safety tips! Please encourage your child to be careful when running outside at recess. I have had quite a few head and limb injuries come to the Health Suite due to children saying they were running, but not looking where they were going! If you have a child who engages in soccer or football or any sport where running is involved, please make sure they come to school wearing appropriate footwear. There have been several injuries to children who were playing a sport involving a ball and running in shoes that were Crocs or sandals. Nice shoes, but they don't provide much in the way of foot stability. Supportive sneakers are best. Also, please ask your student not to throw mulch. I have had several students with debris in their eyes from other students throwing mulch at them. All safety measures reinforced at home are greatly appreciated! Playground accidents always increase with warmer weather.

I am slowly depleting my plastic bag supply to place soiled clothing in when children have an accident. If anyone has a few plastic bags they no longer need, please send in with your student who can drop them off at the Health Suite. That would be much appreciated! In the meantime I am working on finding an environmentally friendly alternative to plastic bags use.

If your student has an upper respiratory illness but is well enough to attend school and you want them to wear a mask during the school day, they can always stop in the Health Suite and pick one up there. That helps to protect the other students and the staff. Healthy children's recipe for April is: <https://www.superhealthykids.com/french-toast-casserole/>. This recipe can be adjusted to use seasonal fruit and you can reduce the amount of sugar called for in the recipe by half and due to the natural sweetness of the fruit, retain lots of sweetness!

Don't forget we're still looking for someone to lead the Movie Night event in May. Please reach out if you're interested.

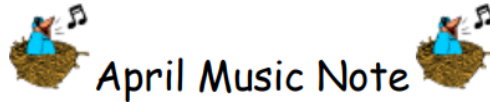

Hello from the Math Committee! April's Math Practice is number 7.

Look for and make use of structure is Math Practice # 7. Mathematically proficient students look closely to discern a pattern or structure. Young students, for example, might notice that three and seven more is the same amount as seven and three more, or they may sort a collection of shapes according to how many sides the shapes have. Older students will see 7×8 equals the well-remembered $7 \times 5 + 7 \times 3$, in preparation for learning about the distributive property. The math practices posters include examples of how students may use math practice #7 in both the primary and intermediate grades.

How do I help my child...

... see structure and generalize in mathematics?

Make a habit of asking your child if they notice any patterns, both in their mathematics work and in the world around them. Encourage them to think about how a specific problem is like others they have solved and how seeing those relationships can be helpful..

... see structure and generalize in mathematics?

Ask

What do you predict will happen next? Why?

What other problems does this remind you of?

What do you notice?

Do you see any patterns?

Does that always work? Why or why not?

Look for and make use of structure.

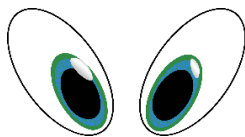


Spring Cleaning??

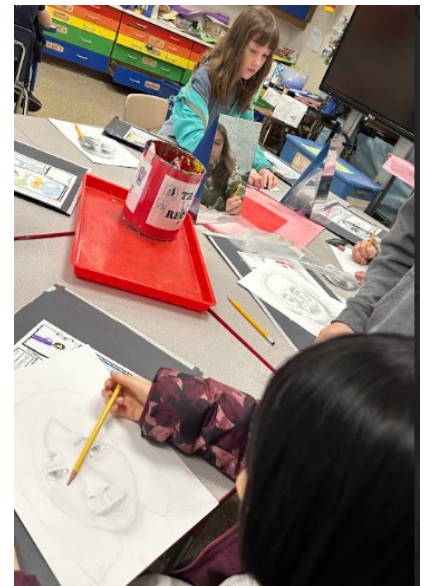


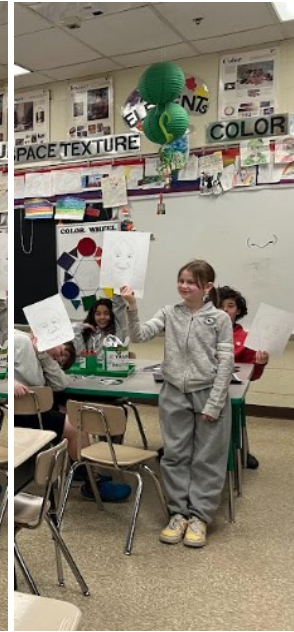
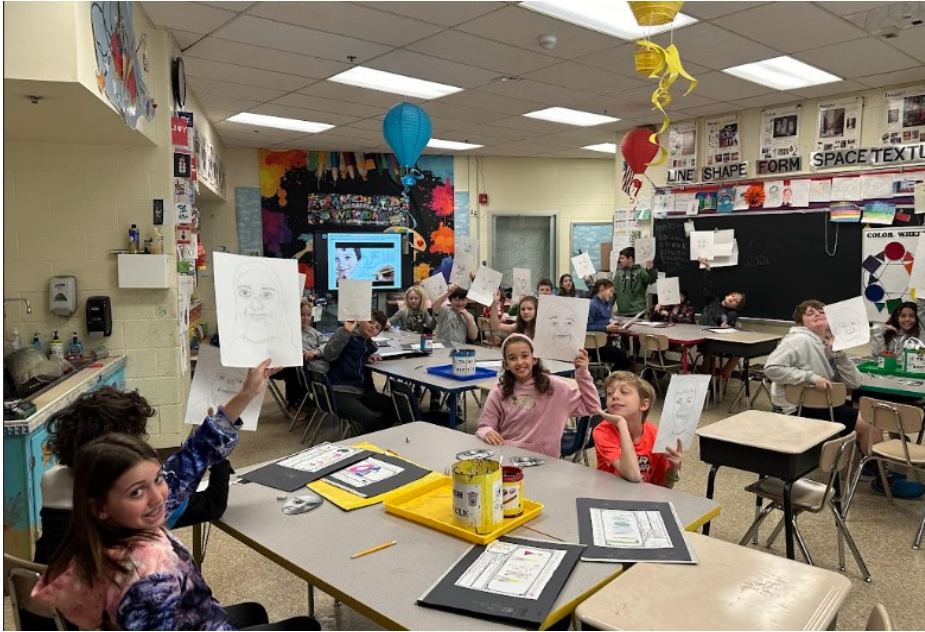
In the Art Room!

Grade 5 and grade 4 artists are continuing to render their Realistic Self Portraits using both observation from a



mirror as well as a photograph. Many famous, portrait artists will be introduced in this unit, including Chuck Close, Amy Sberald, Leonardo da Vinci, Judith Leyster, Rembrandt, Frida Kahlo, Shirin Neshat, and Kehinde Wiley.





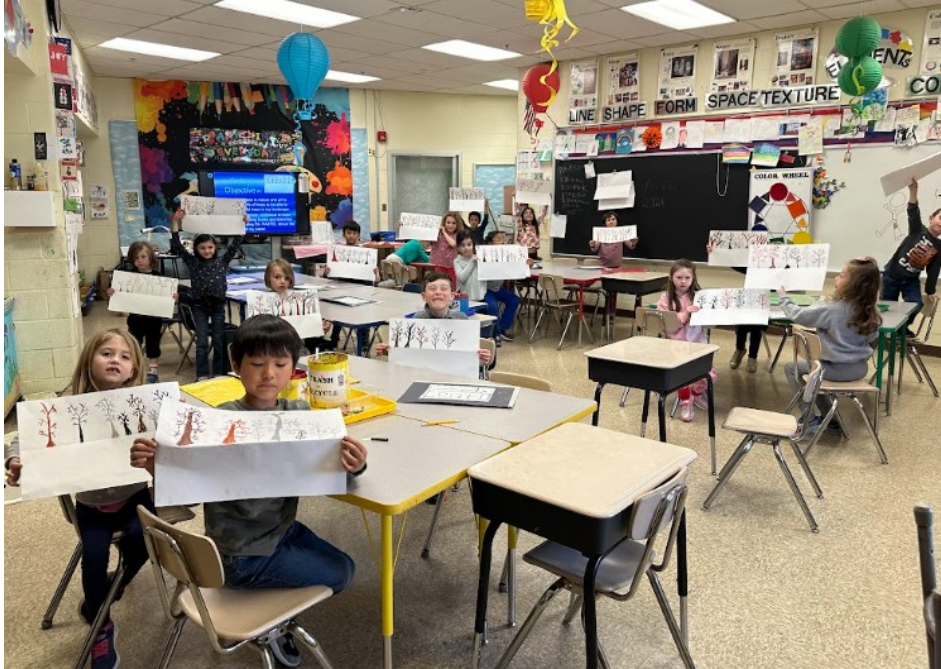
Grade 3 sculptors are just starting their ceramic masterpieces using a variety of clay sculpting techniques. These young artists will be creating a very imaginative Creative Character Sculptures using the “pinchin technique” of ceramic hand-building.



Just in time for Earth Day, artists in grades 1 and 2 are observing and learning



order to create very realistic-looking trees in their Landscape Paintings. These artists will be using two different types of paints including liquid watercolor paint as well as tempera paint to create the parts of their landscape.



The youngest artists in Kindergarten are inspired by artist, Wayne Theibauld to create their Gum Ball Machine Compositions. Students are learning about the Primary and Secondary colors as they create different colored Gum Ball Prints using re-purposed plastic bottle caps as the surface for their prints.
